

## ***This is A Day of New Beginnings...*** by Rev. Bruce Fensterbush

This is the title of a hymn written by Brian Wren and set to a tune written by Carlton Young. It speaks of the new beginning that is available for all of us when we give our lives to Christ. It is a song of hope and faith and I find it to be very inspirational and uplifting.

New beginnings can be wonderful. Each year at this time we celebrate many new beginnings in the lives of our young people. School will soon be underway and that brings a change of grade for our children and youth and perhaps even a change in school. This change can bring a great deal of anxiety into a young person's life as they take on new challenges in the classroom or in their extra curricular activities. The change in grade may also mean making new friends which can be difficult.

Many of our young adults experience new beginnings in college or graduate school or in a new work place. While exciting, these changes can bring with them a great deal of uncertainty. Learning at the post high school level requires discipline and self motivation. Starting a new job requires patience and careful attention to detail.

While it is true that new beginnings are exciting, they can also be stressful.

I have discovered over the years that I can reduce the stress of the new beginnings I face by telling myself over and over that I am not alone in this new thing. Christ is with me. In fact, He is always with me. That is His promise to his disciples in Matthew 28:20. ***"And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."***

This truth is a comfort to me and it gives me strength in those times when I am uncertain about some new or challenging thing that I must face. This truth is also echoed in the fourth verse of the hymn I mentioned earlier. It reads:

**Christ is alive, and goes before us  
To show and share what love can do.  
This is a day of new beginnings;  
Our God is making all things new.**

If you are facing a "new beginning" today, take heart. You don't face it alone. Trust in Christ's promise to go with you all the way. Till next time... ***Pastor Bruce***





## *Missions Updates and Opportunities*

### **Tangier Island 2019 Mission Report**

The team of 33 missionaries from seven area churches, including four volunteers from OUMC, successfully completed the 5<sup>th</sup> Annual one-week trip to Tangier Island, VA in late June. The goal of the trip was primarily spiritual -- to grow closer to Christ, to serve as a team across many denominations, and to serve all people in need on the remote and unique Tangier Island. Service projects included light construction, roofing, plumbing, electrical work, doors and windows, decks and stairs to make things "safer, dryer and warmer" for the older folks living on the island with little or no access to repair services. The team also provided visitation and gift bags to all 32 older shut-ins, provided a "Teen Challenge" to all young adults through devotions with bonfires on the beach, and a kid's "Fun Day" of sports and activities for the younger children. To engage with the population, the team also hosted a Talent Show and Around-the-Island-Fun-Run. All activities had an element of prayer and fellowship. From a purely spiritual perspective, the team completed two devotionals daily with each other, and then provided music and the message during one of the Swain United Methodist Church services on Sunday. The team worked well together with everyone, age 10-65, adding value to this mission. We thank the Lord for guiding and protecting the team!
