

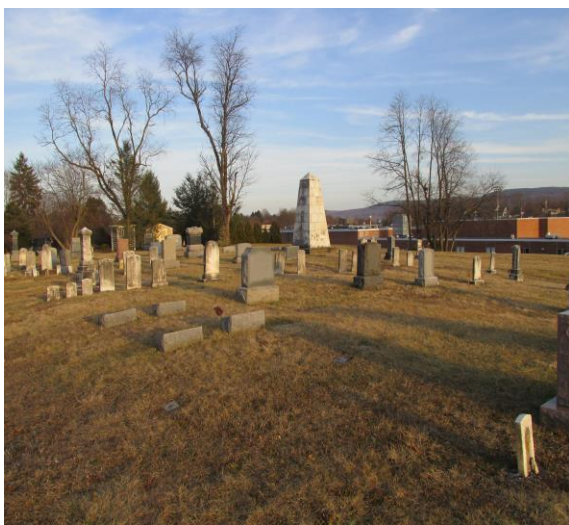
SPRINGVILLE PUBLIC CEMETERY HISTORY

Springville Public Cemetery has been an active cemetery since 1873. It was created by the former United Brethren in Christ Church in historic Boiling Springs, which was located where the cemetery is now. The Springville Cemetery Association was incorporated in 1874 to care for the cemetery.

Over the years, the United Brethren in Christ Church became Otterbein United Methodist Church and in 1998 the church built a new facility just outside of Boiling Springs, in Carlisle.

The Springville Cemetery Association is now a part of Otterbein United Methodist Church. We assure you your loved ones will be cared for in this Christian cemetery in the historic village of Boiling Springs in Cumberland County, Pennsylvania.
